**The important and evolving role** of visual, performing and literary arts in shaping experiences and appreciations of landscapes and the environment as well as providing critical and cultural understandings of them.

**The increasing significance** of the arts in interdisciplinary research proposals

**A dichotomy** between epistemic communities with arts on one side and the sciences and social sciences on the other.

**Limited understanding** about the contribution that can come from the arts and humanities

### Our aims ...

**Debate and re-consider** the role of the artist and the contribution of arts in shaping knowledge and communicating meaning

**Document critical reflections** from a broader community of scientists, artists, philosophers and practitioners on the role of the arts and the artist in landscape, environmental and valuing nature research agendas today.

**Compose a cutting-edge assessment** of the current situation and future prospects for arts-based research in landscape and environmental research today.

**Endorse artists** as essential co-investigators in environmental research.

## Demystifying... Art!

A STARTING POINT IF YOU DON'T KNOW WHERE TO BEGIN

- There is a problematic separation between epistemic communities with the arts on one side and the sciences and social sciences on the other.
- There is 'real research' and 'arts research'
- Considering artist apart from mainstream (scientist) researcher reinforces *unequal power relationships in research* where the latter the privileged ones.
